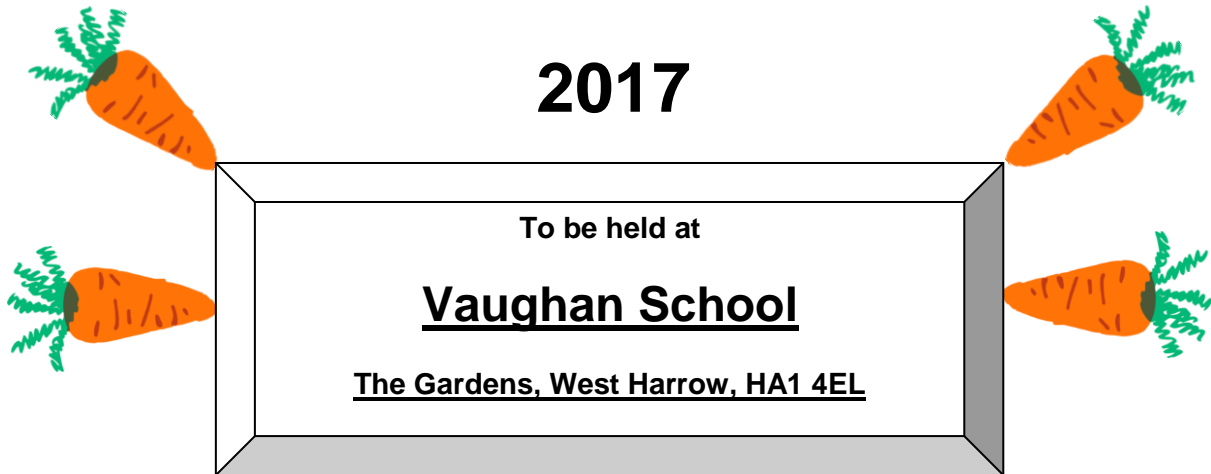

Rules

1. All adult exhibitors must be members of WHAGA. Competition open to members of the Association and families unless otherwise stated. All subscriptions must be paid up to one month before date of the Show.
2. All horticultural Exhibits must have been grown in the garden or allotment of the exhibitor. Pot plants must have been the property of the exhibitor for more than two months.
3. Entries will be accepted with the entrance fee, up to 7.30pm on Thursday, prior to Show. No entries accepted after this date.
4. Where applicable Show will be governed by RHS and NVS Rules.
5. Two or more persons may not exhibit in the same class separately from the same garden or allotment.
6. No exhibitor to be allowed more than one entry in a class, except for Any Other Vegetable or Fruit, in which any number of different kinds of vegetables/fruits may be entered.
7. Preserves must be shown in 340g-454g jars (approx). All entries must have been made within last 12 months and dated using this season's fruit.
Jams, jellies curds and should be covered with a twist or push-on top or wax disc and cellophane. Pickles and chutneys should be covered with a vinegar proof solid top. Labels must be small, white and plain on jar or bottle, stating contents or type. No adverts to appear on jars or lids.
8. Hall to be cleared at 12 noon for Judging. Only Judges and Officials allowed in the Hall whilst judging is in progress.
9. Exhibits must not be removed until after presentations. Any exhibits remaining will be sold by auction.
10. VASES PROVIDED ON THE TABLES MUST BE USED FOR THAT CLASS ONLY.
11. Prize money must be collected before 4.30pm on day of Show.
12. Objections to be made in writing to Show Manager within one hour of the show opening to the public. Committee decisions are final.
13. All Cups and Bowls are held by the Society in perpetuity and held by successful exhibitors for one year only. They should be returned to the Secretary one week before the following year's Show.

PLEASE ENSURE YOU HAVE ENTERED IN THE CORRECT CLASSES, AS NO AMENDMENTS CAN BE MADE ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW.

If you have doubts on how to present your exhibits please seek advice at the Trading Hut and at the Show.

Autumn Show 9th September 2017

Staging 9am to 12 noon. Show opens 3pm. Presentation of prizes at 4.30pm followed by Raffle. Pointing: 1st 3, 2nd 2, 3rd 1, Highly commended ½ .

 - 5 Gladioli: 1 spike
 - 6 Perennials: 1 vase excluding flowers in other classes
 - 7 Mixed Flowers: 1 vase
 - 8 Roses, HT: 3 stage blooms, 3 stems, 1 variety, 1 'bud' stage, 1 'perfect' stage, 1 'full bloom' stage
 - 9 Cluster Roses (Floribunda): 3 stems
 - 10 Rose: 1 large flowered HT
 - 11 Roses: 3 large flowered HT – 1 variety
 - 12 Roses: 3 large blooms HT different varieties
 - 13 6 Fuchsia blooms; own receptacle: 2 or more varieties
 - 14 Vase of Mixed Foliage
 - 15 Flowering plant in pot: excluding Fuchsia
 - 16 Flowering plant in pot: Fuchsia
 - 17 Foliage plant in pot
 - 18 Cactus or Succulent in pot
- For classes 16-18 no pot to exceed 204mm (8ins)**

- 53 Rhubarb: 3 stalks of 1 cultivar with 75mm of leaf at the top
- 54 Sweetcorn: 2 of 1 cultivar

- 56 Potatoes: 4 coloured, 1 cultivar
- 57 Potatoes 4 white, 1 cultivar
- *58* Collection** of potatoes: 3 of each of 3 cultivars
- 59 Tomatoes: 5 plum type
- 60 Tomatoes: 5 tomatoes – other than plum or beefsteak
- 61 Tomatoes: 3 “Beefsteak” type
- 62 Tomatoes: 9 small fruited or cherry type under 35mm
- 63 Tomatoes: 1 truss, predominately ripe
- 64 Tomatoes: 5 any colour except red
- 65 Shallots: 9 of one cultivar over 30mm diameter
- 66 Shallots: small, 9 of 1 cultivar, not over 30mm diameter
- 67 Onions: 3 dressed, over 225g
- 68 Onions: 3 dressed under 225g
- *69* Collection** of Onions: 3 of each, under 225mm, over 225mm and 3 shallots
- 70 Marrows: 2 of 1 cultivar 200mm-380mm in length
- 71 Squash
- 72 Pumpkin

- 73 Cauliflower: 1 cultivar approx 75mm of stalk
- 74 Cabbage: 2 of 1 cultivar 75mm of stalk
- 75 Cucumbers: 2 of 1 cultivar, Ridge or Outdoor
- 76 Cucumbers: 2 of 1 cultivar, House or Frame

- 77 Herbs: 1 container not less than 50mm across of cut culinary herbs (List available in Hut)
- 78 Any other vegetable not previously specified (More than one entry permitted, of different kinds. No. as on p9) MUST be named eg, Oca
- 79 Courgettes: 3, of 1 cultivar
- 80 5 Vegetables: one of each kind. Maximum 10 points each
- *81* Collection** of vegetables: 4 kinds, quantities as per single dish (Space 915mm x 760mm)
- 82 An exhibit of Garden Produce: 1 vase of flowers, 3 kinds of vegetables and/or fruit. Space 915mm x 760mm, Maximum 10 points each
- 83 Longest Runner Bean, excluding stalk
- 84 Heaviest Onion, no top or roots
- 85 Heaviest Tomato
- 86 Heaviest Potato
- 87 Heaviest Marrow: stalk 25mm max
- 88 2 Carrots, 2 potatoes, 2 beetroots of same variety
- 89 Best result from 1 root of Potatoes – (1 root of good quality nominated potatoes witnessed taken up by a committee member)
- 90 A container artistically filled with nature's produce. Space allowed not to exceed 600x450 mm (Anything grown- flowers, fruit and/or veg.)

- 117 Miniature Garden (Not to exceed 300mm x 300mm)
- 118 An item of cross stitch or embroidery
- 119 A handmade card
- 120 A coloured in picture (from an adult colouring-in book)

Dahlia Sizes

Giant	-	Over 260mm diameter
Large	-	Usually between 200mm and 250mm diameter but NOT exceeding 260mm diameter
Medium	-	Usually between 150mm and 200mm diameter but NOT exceeding 220mm diameter
Small	-	Usually between 100mm and 150mm diameter but NOT exceeding 170mm diameter
Miniature	-	Usually between 50mm and 100mm diameter but NOT exceeding 115mm diameter
Small Ball	-	Usually between 100mm and 150mm diameter but NOT exceeding 170mm diameter
Miniature Ball	-	Usually between 50mm and 100mm diameter but NOT exceeding 115mm diameter
Pompon	-	NOT exceeding 52mm diameter
Waterlily/Collette	-	Usually between 115mm and 170mm diameter
